I think that Rowan Williams was also called to steer a very full boat, containing a disparate crew through some very stormy seas and he has, with great skill, led the Anglican Church through some extremely difficult decision-making. We have been extremely fortunate to have such a wise and learned man to lead us through the stormy waves and leave the church in calmer waters.

I am very pleased to announce that the Archbishop will be in the Coventry Diocese on the weekend of 25th to 27th May. As part of this visit he will be preaching at a special service intended for rural communities at the Kenilworth Showground, Stoneleigh. This service, on Sunday 27th. May at 12noon, will be suitable for all ages, and will be followed by informal entertainment, an opportunity to possibly meet the Archbishop and also purchase subsidised food and drink. We are fortunate to welcome Kevin Downham to our Benefice as an additional Reader to work alongside Elizabeth and myself. Kevin will be licensed at the Easter Day service at 6pm on 8th April at St. Peter's, Bourton. You are most welcome to come and support Kevin as he is formally licensed as our Reader.

We are very fortunate to have so many committed people who help keep our lovely churches in good order, giving time to help clean it, arrange flowers, read lessons, serve coffee, mow grass and much more. Music for Easter

It is interesting to reflect that Easter, a feast established to relive human suffering and rebirth, has given rise to some of the most sensuous and beautiful music there is.

J. S. Bach tells the Easter story in both his 'St. Matthew Passion' and 'St. John Passion'. I remember the tingling feeling I had in certain sections of St. Matthew Passion when my choir sang it a few years ago. If you prefer shorter pieces, many of Bach's cantatas are suitably reflective for Easter.

The medieval 'Stabat Mater', which describes Mary standing at the foot of the cross, has been set to the most painfully beautiful music by Dvorak, Vivaldi, Verdi

and Parsifal. Vivaldi's version is perhaps the most well-known but Dvorak's 'Stabat Mater', which was composed on the death of his two-day-old daughter, is heart-rending.

It is also worth remembering that Handel's 'Messiah' was originally intended to be performed at Easter rather than Christmas.

Stravinsky's 'Rite of Spring' is music of a less religious nature, which is stirring, joyful yet, at times, nightmarish – in common, you could say, with the overtly religious Passions, Stabat Maters and the Messiah.

You could, of course, intersperse one or two of these classical pieces with secular pieces such as Irving Berlin's 'Easter Parade', or the old favourite, 'Hot cross buns, hot cross buns, one a penny, two a penny, hot cross buns'! Aileen Withington
