## ZAMBIA—An appeal for help

Many Birdsong readers will remember the Mackie family, who lived at Sherington in Main Street for several years before moving to Zambia. Caroline is working at Mercy Ministries, a community school in one of the poorer areas of Lusaka, which outreaches to the local community with prayer, food, clothes etc. Caroline is a teacher by profession, and helps to run the Special Needs class at the school.

Another project Caroline is involved with is Kasisi Orphanage, which is run by Polish nuns. They have 250 children of all ages, from newborns to adults. Caroline runs the pre-school.

Chris and I are travelling out to see Angus and Caroline at the beginning of March and will be visiting the charities there. We are hoping to fill some suitcases with donations for both her causes. When asked what they need she said that both charities desperately need clothes (any size and for any season) as well as basic essentials such as soap, toothbrushes and toothpaste. They also need baby milk powder for the tiny babies they often have there. For the pre-school, she would love puzzles, little toy cars (matchbox size), toy animals, and particularly art and craft stuff (especially glue)!
